





Meeting starts 8pm, but feel free to come earlier for dinner and a drink (or two).





NEWSLETTER MARCH/APRIL

Past Events Thanks to Rick Poole and Sea-Life for their hospitality during the film night on March 4th. The films included a re-enactment of a diving accident off Catalina Island, California and the subsequent enquiry. Not many of us there picked up all the mistakes made by the divers, which goes to show that poor diving practices can go un-noticed and become bad habits. The Red Sea film was made in depths down to 240' and had some incredible shots of very large morays being hand fed, patted and even taking fish held in a divers own teeth



without biting the diver. The ten pin bowl was its usual success and despite all efforts to cause the abandonment of the Broughton Island trawler dive, the Club was able to secure petrol supplies at Port Stephens and the dive went ahead as planned. Even with limited boat space all those divers who went on the Terrigal boat dive on Sunday the 30th were able to get two boat dives. Les Graham took us out to a Grey Nurse-ary which was quite a buzz but unfortunately the 130' depth limited our bottom time to a mere 11 mins. (The tables (U.S.) give the bottom time as 15 mins with 1min at 10', however the currently recommended practice is to take bottom time as time from descentstart to time of reaching the first deco stop, or surface. Ascent rate is 30 feet per min. Deco time is included in dive duration.)



At long last we appear to have space to publish a list of protected species of fish and regulations applying to spearfishing in NSW. The following fish are totally protected.... Elegant Wrasse

Blue Devil Estuary Cod Giant Groper

Blue, Brown, or Red Groper may not be taken by net or by spear, amateur line fishermen may take two groper per day. Red Morwong may be taken by spear, however there is a bag limit of 5 fish per day per diver. The spearing of fish on SCUBA is an offence as is the taking of crayfish. No crayfish may be taken by a diver using any device other than a gloved hand and there is a bag limit on crays of 5 per day, further whilst on or near the water, it is an offence for a fisherman to have more than ten crayfish in his possession at any time. Apart from these regulations be reminded that legal size limits

also apply to non-protected fish species, abalone (bag limit of 15) and crayfish. Heavy penalties up to \$500 apply to breaches of these regulations. Occasionally cases of prosecutions are reported in the local or daily newspapers and fines levied may appear to be trivial, however be warned that gear (i.e. any diving equipment not just the gun) may also be conviscated or at least impounded until the time of hearing. If there is some dispute over responsibility or ownership of equipment at the time of arrest it is possible that the buddies' gear may be impounded as well.

It is an offence to transport a speargun on enclosed waters. The "enclosed waters" refers to areas gazetted periodically by the Government and may not be obviously enclosed. It is also probable that some items of diving equipment are classified as offensive weapons viz, powerheads not attached to a shaft and knives of some sizes and designs. Bearing all this in mind, if you intend to go spearing then make sure that you know what you are doing lest you become responsible for your buddy losing his gear.

Due to the great interest in the Port Hacking boat dive on April 13th it was decided at the last general meeting to have another local dive on Sunday 27th of April leaving from Yowie Bay boat ramp at 8 am. People at the April meeting know about it already, so I hope that this newsletter reaches absentees by then.






